Upcoming Programs

Presentation- Jim Spina- Seneca Falls Community Center and Programs

The SF Community center closed to the public on 3/16/20, resulting in 2 basketball tournaments getting canceled. Lost the Youth Lacrosse season, youth Little League got pushed to late summer. They were able to reopen on a limited basis on 6/29/20 when the Town Board allowed them to open after he created safety protocols. They have still not reopened for afterschool and weekend programs for students. They could not have their usual summer programs at the parks.

After developing safety protocols, they were able to have 3 sports camps for the summer, basketball, soccer and lacrosse. The protocols including temperature checks, no parents allowed into the camps, social distancing while practicing, mask wearing, and not sharing equipment. They received great support from the parents and the students and were very proud to get through it.

They also had 2 family drive in movie night in the parking lot. They partnered with the SF Library in planning and organizing. They had popcorn and candy donated and both were very well attended.

In June, they also allowed adults to use the gym for walking and in the pool room, as well as the meeting room. All are required to follow Covid guidelines. They have not been able to open the fitness room at this time, due to lack of staffing.

They were able to host the Halloween program in the park, instead of the usual downtown trick or treating, they had 25 different businesses and groups participate and had around 500 people come to the park that day.

The community center is currently focusing on moving forward and planning the next steps. They are currently doing Basketball registration, even if they aren't able to open the program on time so they want to be prepared when and if they are able to get it started, they will be ready. They are prepping in advance for the opening of the fitness room, they will be working with the health department to make sure they are able to follow guidelines as well as staffing the fitness room for cleaning, they would like to have it ready for beginning of the New Year. They are also working on getting ready to reopen their after-school programs.
